The Lord Mayor's Awards for Urban Design

The Lord Mayor's Awards for Urban Design celebrates and recognises architectural achievements in Nottingham. The awards are given to outstanding projects in the fields of architecture, planning, landscape and urban design that create new exciting, safe and sustainable spaces and buildings.

The Student Concept category was initiated in 2005 to encourage participation from up and coming talent and to promote excellence in the study of the built environment. The awards provide an opportunity for students work to be recognised and assessed by experts in architecture, landscape and urban design. The category is aimed at all those studying within the built environment field from first to final year students.

Judging Process

At the first stage of judging, entries will be assessed and shortlisted by officers. A judging panel consisting of Julian Marsh (Marsh Grochowski), Andy Purvis (Maber Associates), Denise Ellis (Franklin Ellis) and Fiona Heron (Wolfgang and Heron) will assess the shortlisted projects and choose a winner.

Prize

A certificate and £100 will be presented to the winning entry.

The Awards Ceremony

Winners will be announced and receive their awards at a prestigious ceremony on Friday 20th November 2009. The event will be held at the Council House Ballroom, Nottingham with over 100 guests in attendance. All those who have been shortlisted will be invited to attend the awards with certificates and prizes being presented by the Lord Mayor of Nottingham.

Publication

Winning and commended projects will be featured in a glossy leaflet and will be circulated to key stakeholders, architectural practices, developers, partners at a local, regional and national level.

How to enter

The awards will be for projects in Nottingham only; both group and individual projects are eligible.

Entries will need to be received by 3rd August 2009 and include the following information: -

- A signed and completed entry form
- A concise description of the scheme, including an explanation of the design approach. The description must include reference to accessibility, sustainability, practicality (fit for purpose), aesthetics and benefits to the surrounding area (500 words maximum).
- A site location plan on which the scheme is clearly marked.
- Images - in particular those that show the scheme in relation to it's context and different views. This supporting information should be presented on A3 formats and/or a maximum of two A1 panels.
